Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 18th day of April 1875, between J. H. Briggs & Co., of the City of Petersburg, Virginia, of the first party, and Austin D. Chapman of Tombstone Co. of the second party, in pursuance of the 15th section of the 115th Chapter of the Code of 1873, viz: That the said J. H. Briggs & Co. agreed, in their bonds, to furnish to the said Austin D. Chapman supplies to the amount of not exceeding fifty dollars to enable the said Austin Chapman to carry on his farming operations for the current year, 1875, in the County of Tombstone. In consideration of said advance to be made by the said J. H. Briggs & Co. to the said Austin D. Chapman do hereby bind himself, his heirs, administrators and assigns, to assign to the said J. H. Briggs & Co. all their crops of cotton made during the year, and do furthermore, convey and agree, that the said J. H. Briggs & Co. shall be entitled to have all the crops and any moneys, one store cash, that is now and shall be in the hands of said Austin D. Chapman shall have lawfully paid off and discharged. And the party of the second part do hereby waive the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this advance.
