Articles of Agreement made and entered into this 7th day of April 1875 between H. H. Derry & Co. of the City of Petersburg, Virginia, of the first part, and Austin S. Chapman & Co. of the second part, in pursuance of the 14th section of the 115th Chapter of the Code of 1870, viz: That the said H. H. Derry & Co. agreed, in their bond, to furnish to the said Austin S. Chapman & Co. the amount of not recording fees, dollars to enable the said Austin S. Chapman to carry on his farming operations for the current year 1875, in the Parish of Iberville, Louisiana. In consideration of said advance to be made by the said H. H. Derry & Co. to the said Austin S. Chapman do hereby bind himself, his heirs, administrators and assigns, to assign to the said H. H. Derry & Co. all their crops of cotton made during the year, and do furthermore covenant and agree, that the said H. H. Derry & Co. shall be entitled to have on all the crops and any moneys, one third thereof until the entire indebtedness of said Austin S. Chapman shall have been fully paid off and discharged. And the party of the second part do hereby waive the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this advance.
