This Deed made this 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1875, between C. S. Gray and George Gorham, of the first part and Charles H. Edwards, of the other part,  
Witnesseth: That whereas C. S. Gorham Esq; and J. D. Gorham have consented to  
become lessees for term and duration of administration of said lands, to wit,  
the same bounded West by C. S. Gray and Margarath his wife stands by and of  
same land inseparably and hereditarily married, from all less by reason of such  
partition, from time of the death of his late wife, that she left C. S. Gray and  
Margarath his wife debts growing out of his late wife, as with respect to the title  
of land upon which they had reside, containing thereon meadow and City and  
more or less and bounded by the lands of Christopher M. D. Gorham and others  
and is hereby acknowledged and agreed by the grantors with the trustee  
of the said C. S. Gorham and J. D. Gorham should partition being left by reason  
thereof, consisting for the said Margarath Gorham or her executors or trustees  
and that the said trustee shall sell the said land after reasonable notice  
for cash and pay such taxes as they may have sustained and be necessary
