Articles of Agreement made and entered into on this 15th day of April 1875, between James C. Donke of the County of Loudoun State of Virginia of the one part, and J. H. Donke of the same County and State of the other part. Pursuant to the provisions of the 15th Section of the 15th Chapter of the Code of 1873, the said James C. Donke, agrees and his heirs to furnish to the party of the second part, supplies during the present year 1875 not to exceed \$200, two hundred & no cents paid to Cash on his farming operations on the lands of James C. Donke in the County of Loudoun for the present year, in consideration of said advance to be made by the said James C. Donke. The said party of the second part binds himself here to and to assign or deliver to the said James C. Donke, all his crop of Cotton and seed cotton made by him during the year 1875. And hereby covenants and agrees that this instrument shall constitute a lien on one mule gray mare and two South Hakes or two Cows and one calf, in addition to the lien on the crops as above bound until the said sum of \$200 two hundred dollars or so much thereof as may be owing, shall have been fully paid off and discharged. And the said party of the second part, hereby waives the benefit of the Statute with as to this obligation is contained. Borey the following signature and seal this 15th day of April 1875.
