

This Deed made this 2^d day of July 1571 between the said Commissioners of the said part and the said Bradshaw of the other part, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witness: that whereas by a deed in the said of Peter & John Griffin, late in Southampton Circuit Court, the said Commissioners and directed amongst other things, after the payment of the bond of \$ by the said Bradshaw to the said Bradshaw, a deed with special warranty for the tract of land for which said bond was executed, and against the said Peter Bradshaw has fully paid and satisfied said bond. And therefore this said Bradshaw has the said Peter Bradshaw Commissioners at aforesaid for and in consideration of the premises and in the further sum of one dollar in hand paid, to him this grant and convey unto the said Peter Bradshaw with special warranty the tract or parcels of lands located at "by Bradshaw's River tract" and said to contain 120 acres more or less.

This Agreement entered into this 20th day of April 1572 between Sir A. Turner and J. C. Rouse, merchants and partners trading under the firm name of Turner & Rouse, of the one part, and C. S. Beckman of the other part, Witness: that whereas the said C. S. Beckman is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to stand during the year 1572, whenever, in money or supplies from the said Turner & Rouse to the amount of four hundred dollars, or the value thereof of \$400 (D) late cotton beyond which time the said C. S. Beckman shall not go, and the said Turner & Rouse having agreed on their part, to furnish the said advances, now the said C. S. Beckman on the part, in consideration of the above premises, has hereby given a lien to the said Turner & Rouse, on the crops which may be made during the year 1572 upon the land in the cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been or will be expended. And this lien is granted under and by of the Great Seal of the Colony of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1572, entitled "An Act to Secure Advances for Agricultural Purposes."
