This Agreement entered into this 25th day of February 1775 between John and Benjamin of the first part and Daniel S. Perry of the other part, together as follows, that whereas the said D. S. Perry is desirous to engage in the culture of the soil, and is desirous to obtain during the year 1775, a tract of land in many or several parts but said Perry and Benjamin for the benefit of said household and fifty other persons beyond which amount the said Perry shall pay, and the said Perry and Benjamin having agreed on their part to furnish land advanced, And the said D. S. Perry on his part and in consideration of the above promised and hereby gives a Lien to the said Perry and Benjamin in the crops which may be made during the year 1775 upon the tract of land the above amount of advances has been so intended to have been repaid the said sum is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia passed April 2^d 1775, entitled an act to remove advances for agricultural purposes being the following signature and seal
