This Deed made this 26<sup>th</sup> day of August in the year 1875 between  
Sam'l R. Peasey and Mary J. Peasey his wife of the first part and  
Henry S. Kelly of the second part, Stonington County, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Fifty Dollars, six hundred pounds, by the party of the second  
part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said party of the  
first part, have given, granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and do  
now grant, give, grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said party of the  
second part, our word of land lying and being in Stonington County,  
Virginia and will lands situated in south west corner of my cow field  
formerly known as the General field. The said part of land bounded on  
both of S. and E. R. Road. from the bank of said Road and runs along  
the County Road (formerly known as Old Mill path) about three feet  
a distance of twenty yards to a stile, and in straight line from said  
stile east to another state twenty yards and from said stile in straight  
line southwards to the head of the S. and E. R. Road and thence along  
the line of said Road West to the starting point, to have and to hold the said  
area of land the said Henry S. Kelly and his heirs forever and the party  
of the first part remaining to have and defend forever the premises here  
conveyed against the claim or claims of any and all persons whatever.
