

This Oath made the 14 day of May in the year 1775 between John Brindley and Con. D. his wife J. D. Brindley and Mary J. D. his wife and S. A. Brindley and Mary his wife of the County of Southampten, State of Virginia. At the first part, and Joseph Granger of said County and State of the second part, being first put in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they, the said parties of the first part do give, bargain, sell and convey with general warranty, unto the said Joseph Granger, all of Black Bottom piece or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampten and near the village of Brantley land bounded as follows, to wit by a piece of land belonging to Henry Clements, on the south by the Brantley and South Conway County roads, on the East by the lands of Joseph Granger and on the West by the lands of Major Doughton and by and Henry Clements, bounded by survey to contain five acres of land more or less to have and to hold the aforesaid piece of land to him the said Joseph Granger his heirs and assigns forever.
