

This *Deed* made the eighteenth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty first, between Thomas J. Pringle of the first part, and Alexander Morris Pringle of the second part, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnesses, That the said Thomas J. Pringle, for and in consideration of the Natural Love and affection which he bears towards his son, the said A. M. Pringle, and in the further consideration of an agreement which he has entered his said Thomas J. Pringle to and with his wife Clara Pringle before now deceased, the said agreement having been made by the said Thomas J. Pringle with his said wife only, in and to the said although not being binding in conscience, and recognizing by the said grantor, an affectionate relationship of and as a father of respect to his said wife. And the said Deed Witnesseth, That the said Thomas J. Pringle, for and in consideration of the premises, with loving grace and convey unto the said Alexander Morris all of that tract or parcel of land, lying in the said County and State, in which the said A. M. Pringle was residing, supposed to contain about twelve hundred acres more or less and bounded by the parcel of the said Thomas J. Pringle, to J. C. Cragg, Joseph A. Davis and others. It being the said tract which was granted and conveyed to the said Thomas J. Pringle by Deed of Alexander and John Jamison Pringle Pringle and Henry J. Pringle his wife, and David D. Byrnes and Henry C. Byrnes his wife, recorded in the Clerk's Office of the said County Court of said County, on the 8th day of December A.D. 1861. And also granted and conveyed to the said A. Morris Pringle by the said Thomas J. Pringle and David D. Byrnes, (Witnesses of David D. Byrnes) by Deed recorded in the said office on the 10th day of December A.D. 1861. And also granted and conveyed to the said Trustee by said David D. Byrnes by Deed recorded in the said County Clerk's Office on the 11th day of April A.D. 1866. And also granted and conveyed to the said David D. Byrnes by Deed recorded in the said office on the 12th day of April A.D. 1837. And also granted and conveyed to the said Alexander and Mary Ingle Alexander and wife. And also granted and conveyed to the said David D. Byrnes by Deed from George A. Davis and Andrew Davis, recorded in the said Clerk's Office on the 10th day of June A.D. 1853. In witness whereof all of which said Deeds is hereby made for the sake of Certainty, as to boundaries and title &c. And the said Thomas J. Pringle with loving grace and convey unto the said Alexander Morris Pringle with general Warranty, all of the before described tract of land together with all of the buildings, improvements, appurtenances and hereditaments in anywise belonging or attached thereto, to him, the said Alexander Morris Pringle, and his heirs forever. Notar on the 1st day of October 1875, J. S. Camp and J. A. Camp, by their Deed of Deed dated the day aforesaid, did convey unto John A. Willy, the said Alexander Pringle, the following property, to wit: a tract of land in Southampton County Virginia, containing four hundred and forty eight acres, more or less, and adjoining the lands of William Coleman, George Gray, Corbitts White and others; also three acres, sixteen and six rods, and all the tracts, more or less, and also and also, more or less, also all their rights, title and interest in a stone slab lying near Frankfort bounded by the lands of John Davis Pringle, John Pringle and R. J. & H. Kelly, the same that was heretofore of John Davis Pringle. In Deed to have the payment of five thousand dollars with interest as herein named unto R. J. and H. Kelly or assigns. And also the said sum of five thousand dollars with all interest thereon had been paid. This Deed was signed and sealed the 16th day of September 1875, between the said John A. Willy, Pringle as agent, of the one part, and the said
