Ester the said William Pope and Clara his wife, each brought with her own and several former all their interests in black slaves or parcels of land lying in the County of Northampton State of Virginia, named as the said Johnathan Johnson following first and a half acre by survey more or less, and bounded as follows: on the north and this by the land of David Todd, and on the South by the Express Chained and together with all and singular the appurtenances belonging thereto to have and to hold the same forever, for and to the use and behoof of the said J. A. Ester and his heirs and assigns forever. He giving the following covenants and

And to have the parties of the second party, to have a line upon all the crops of Cotton, and to have the same produced this present year 1875. And all the slaves he may get this present year

1875, or may be introduced into by the said J. A. Ester, shall not be sold this the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May 1875.
