Moore of the City of Richmond North Carolina of the other part, Witnesseth that after mature debate and heard in the Court of Charles River 90. for 10. in testimony where appointed Commissioner, either one of whom might act, either duty sh. should be to provide to sell to the highest bidder, in the manner and on the terms contained in the

Wesley Second, in the possession of said deed did on the 17th day of December 1775, forward to sell the said deed and estate where the said B. B. Moore became the purchaser of such heretofore described being the legal bidder therefor, having bid the sum of \$765.00, and whereas, while the said deed had been removed by operation of law, the sale of the said estate of said B. B. Moore, and said J. Wesley Second appointed Receiver to collect the purchase money for said deed estate which was now being fully paid, and whereas at the September term 1775 the said J. Wesley Second, was appointed a special Commissioner for the purpose and ended, as directed to convey by process due and special authority, and at the last of the present was the said B. B. Moore the legal title to the tract of land purchased by him as above.

Wesley Second, special Commissioner, as aforesaid, did grant and convey unto the said B. B.
