This Clerk made the 10th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy five James H. Corroon and Catharine Maria his wife (she was formerly Barrie) and Catherine Barrie, of the County of Shenandoah in the State of Virginia of the one part, and Thomas Barrie of the County of Shenandoah and State of the other part, Agreeable that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and ten dollars the said James H. Corroon had, Catharine Maria his wife, and Catherine Barrie, do grant with general warranty, unto the said Thomas Barrie and to his heirs and assigns forever, the following real estate, to wit: a part of the lands of which Onett Barrie died seized and possessed and bequeathed to the said parties of the first part above named by his said Onett Barrie in his last will and testament and support, to wit: certain twenty one acres or less and Commencing at a lighted post on the side of the road in the end of a ditch near Thomas Barrie's shop above named said ditch twenty feet wide across to the land of said Onett Barrie and a line of marked trees some distant to a pine in Hillman Co. Kentucky line, thence down said Onett's lot nearly back to Benjamin S. Corroon's line, or London and James Corroon's line, thence down said Corroon's line to the first post, thence up said side road to the lighted post, the Commencement, do have and to hold said divided lands together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto, unto the said James H. Corroon and Catharine Maria his wife and Catherine Barrie Perpetually, they have the right to convey the said land, to the said Thomas Barrie, that the said Thomas Barrie shall have quiet possession of the land, that they have done so ask to remember the said land; and that they will execute such further agreements of said land as may be requisite.
