

This 10th of December and date made this 10th day of November 1875 between Caleb E. Story and wife Adeline wife Story of the first part and Susan J. Lewis of the second part, Bladensburg, that for and in consideration of \$1000 dollars and fifty dollars, to have and to pay to the party of the first part, the sum of which is hereby acknowledged. The party of the first part, do warrant, still and forever, and by these presents do grant, sell and convey to the party of the second part with general attorney, the following and that is to wit, one tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Prince George containing one hundred and forty six and half acres, about two and one-half miles from the said town or city to her and her heirs forever, and bounded as follows. North and east by the lands of Peter Johnson, while by the south and west of C. Carter and back by the lands of Oldland Carter. Said tract of land is usually called the Carter's Ciffin tract.

I, Dr. W. C. Carter, a Notary Public for the County of Prince George, being asked what Caleb E. Story whose name is signed to the above writing, leaving date November 10th, 1875, has acknowledged the same before me and my County agreeable. And I further certify that J. C. Story whose name is signed to the writing above, personally appeared before me in the County aforesaid and being questioned of the title and right of Caleb E. Story his husband, and having the said writing fully explained to her, she, the said J. C. Story acknowledged she had, nothing to her self, and that she had willingly executed the same and does not wish to retract it.

The District of Columbia and sold from Caleb E. Story wife to Susan J. Lewis, was this day received and together with the certificate hereto annexed, acknowledged to receive.

Not Bladensburg the 10th day of November 1875 and thereon eight hundred and twenty five thousand two hundred and twenty five dollars and twenty five cents, were paid to the party of the first part, Caleb E. Story, and to the party of the second part, Susan J. Lewis, of the first part, a tract of land situated in the County of Prince George State of Virginia, situated, where the said Dr. J. D. Biggs and Dr. Charles A. Rogers, of the first part do grant unto Caleb E. Story, Dees of the second part, one hundred and twenty five acres. Bounded by the lands of C. C. Vaughan, John Bellard Jr., Daniel Lassiter and lands owned by the Old Smith family tract and over long river name. Middle body, purchased of Dr. C. Carpenter, in trial to secure a bond due Dr. C. Carpenter by the party of the first part, leaving date Nov. 10, 1875 and due January 17th 1876 with interest at 6 per cent per annum. That the conditions of this debt is that of the said Biggs and Dr. Charles A. Rogers do not pay the said bond on or before the 17th day of January 1876 that the said Dr. C. Carpenter shall make the money according to law and be entitled to 5 per cent on each bond beyond the period of any time to said Dr. J. D. Biggs and Dr. Charles A. Rogers, without further demands.
