a Justice and Ann Maria S. Partridge his wife grantors of the first part and Thomas D. Partridge  
grantee of the second part, Witnesses that the said Thomas D. Partridge and Ann Maria S. Partridge  
do hereby grant unto the said Thomas D. Partridge a certain lot or tract of land situate  
in the town of Jamestown and County of Southampton  
Containing one acre and bounded on the north by the lands of W. M. Chesapeake and on the south  
by the lands of J. S. Greenwood and west and east by the land of J. S. Greenwood. The Deeds to  
be made for this day to Oliver W. Smith, Creek & Co. John D. Hill and George J. Bond  
for \$100 each payable here in six and twelve months after date, and it is hereby covenanted  
and agreed that the said Thomas D. Partridge and Ann Maria S. Partridge his wife shall remain  
in quiet and peaceable possession of the said tract and lot of land in law <sup>fully</sup> until the 1<sup>st</sup>  
of December 1796. Should any dispute arise in the execution of any or all of the abovesaid  
acts and when agreed made by Oliver W. Smith, Creek & Co. John D. Hill or  
George J. Bond representative, the said Thomas D. Partridge after thirty days notice by public  
advertisement of said day shall sell at public auction to the highest bidder for Cash the said tract  
and lot and any part of the above mentioned acts as shall be best expedient and the balance  
of the purchase money if any pay over to the said Thomas D. Partridge and Ann Maria S.
