This Deed made the 2d day of December 1875, between Richard Johnson, Broker of the County of Gloucester and State of Virginia of the first party, and R. A. Holland, trustee of said County and State of the second party, as trustee, Wethersfield, what for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, to the said R. A. Johnson, with good long and full and County and State of the said R. A. Holland, trustee, all of the following personal property to wit: Household board of bags, thirty barrels of flour, three barrels of powder and shot, one barrel each of flour and meal, shorted flour, and all the other household and kitchen furniture of the said Broker, consisting of of crock, pots, plates, dishes, cups and saucers, knives and forks, and all other property coming under the said name, and not given to have and to hold the aforesaid personal property to him, the said R. A. Holland, trustee has had and acquired, former Deed, to record to R. R. Coffey the sum of four dollars and twenty seven cents from the 2d day of December 1875, and terminably, that whereas the said Richard Johnson has this 2d day of December 1875, heretofore his servitors of God and the said Richard Johnson and his son, payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, and Constitution, shall be the said Richard Johnson's trust of this Commonwealth and be of good behavior for the period of twelve months, from this said 2d day of December 1875, and the condition of this said trust is such that should the said Richard Johnson die, the same to be good behavior as aforesaid, that should he die and of no effect, but should he go freehold and land to the Commonwealth of Virginia, then the said Richard Johnson, shall be indemnified by the said Richard Johnson all just and lawful property heretofore possessed and held by him of record of his said or prior to the time to the Commonwealth of Virginia (and the same shall be the sole right of the said Richard Johnson as trustee), and the County of the said Virginia, holding the following depositions and seal the day and year above written.
