Watkins, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said A. A. Atkinson and William C. his wife do grant unto the said William C. Watkins, with criminal warranty, all of his, the said Atkinson's property of every kind and description belonging to

This Agreement made this 27th day of December 1821 between A. A. Atkinson and wife of the first part and John D. Dorman, Deeds Clerk, and John D. Dorman, Deeds Clerk of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said John D. Dorman being indebted unto the said A. A. Atkinson the sum of Five hundred Dollars due by note bearing interest from date and of and from date until the agreement and payable twelve months after date, bears this day granted, conveyed and warranted unto the said John D. Dorman, Deeds Clerk and agent of the said A. A. Atkinson the following personal estate now in the possession of the said John D. Dorman and himself in former contracts or in trust, thereof as is therein contained, and may be proved by the annexed paper, for the true payment thereof of the said debt to be made the said Dorman, Dorman and Company, in trust unto the said Atkinson for the benefit of the said Atkinson, his heirs and assigns the following property and in addition thereunto five hundred and two in trust, either presently as may be herein named. To wit: the personal estate of goods or all the goods he may have at the maturity of said 3rd note of date as back of day all of his household and kitchen furniture, also about 5 or six labor cattle. The said property to be held and jointly owned, unto the said John D. Dorman, Deeds Clerk and agent for A. A. Atkinson his heirs and assigns without let or hindrance that of the separate sum of Five hundred Dollars due by note and payable 12 months after date and interest and estimated to be received by the said Atkinson a longer time than the days named, unto the
