Now all men by these presents that N. H. Griffith Justice of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, being a householder and the head of a family, do make and by virtue of an Act of Assembly of Virginia approved April 27th 1776, entitled "an Act to provide in what manner land or what conditions a householder or head of a family shall sit upon and hold a household, and personal personal property for the benefit of himself and family exempt from sale for debt," do set apart the following property to hold exempt from any seizure, garnishment or sale under any execution, order or other process issued out any court for debt or debt: One bed, bedstead and furniture of the value of 10 s. six half dozen of the value of 1 s. three head of cattle valued at 10 s. 2 pigs valued at 10 s. for large valued at 10 s. the said property not amounting in value to 10 s. nor to one hundred and eleven shillings only.
