the weight of which is fully acknowledged. He and Hardy late did her do grant unto the said  
Mr J Schulte Doctor thereof head of cattle and other stock from now, yester day being day one month,  
two hundred and forty five bushels of Corn, two hams, bacon and ham, two barrels and  
one barrel of feathers, twenty five bushels of Corn, two hams, bacon and ham, two barrels and  
one barrel of feathers, in trust to serve a rate of four hundred dollars due Feb 10 last and said  
rate dated 5<sup>th</sup> January 1776.
