This Deed was made and entered into this 10th day of December 1876 between Sarah Jane Carr of the one part and Parker D. Story of the other part, whereby that the said Sarah Jane Carr for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred and eighty dollars to her in hand paid by the said Parker D. Story at and before the making and signing of these presents, that the said Sarah Jane Carr with good title granted, conveyed and delivered unto the said Parker D. Story all her interest, being an undivided half part in the real estate of which the late George W. Story died seized and possessed and which is bounded as follows to wit: beginning at the corner of the Park Branch place up the run of the said Branch to a small branch of the dividing line between the said tract and the land of John Samuel Ellis and Reuben J. Pope known as the said Branch to the head thereof, thence along the line of the said Reuben J. Pope to a stationer divided to the school house, thence down the said line to the mill pond, thence along the line of the said branch to the mill dam, thence down the run of said dam up to the beginning, all of said land is held by Mrs. George W. Story during her life and it is hereby agreed between the parties to this deed, that the half part of said land hereby conveyed shall be returned to the said Sarah Jane Carr and her heirs for as it is now a burial ground.
