

Southampton County: At the Clerk's office January 10th 1776
This Deed of Bargain and Sale found by the Commissioners to be his act and deed, and admitted to record.

This Deed, made the 10th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, between Drank Holland and Benjamin L. his wife, of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia, of the one part, and Carol G. Vaughan of the same part, of the other part, Witnesseth: That in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty hundred Dollars the said Drank Holland and Virginia L. his wife, do grant unto the said Carol G. Vaughan and to her heirs and assigns, forever, the following well stated, to wit: a plot of land, in the Village of Brantley, Southampton County, aforesaid, in the South West Corner thereof, by the junction of the two streets, fronting fifty six feet more or less on the East, and the same on the West being the same, and its thickness and breadth said being three hundred and ten (310) feet bounded north by the road which runs East and West or nearly so, land by the street which runs north and South, or nearly so, South by the Store house lot of A. H. Taylor's, sit south and by the lot of Nicholas Thomas's, which sit west, and West by a street, and which lot was sold by the said Carol and dwelling house, other good house and stable and other improvements, and which lot was sold was purchased by said Holland of C. H. Rappahannock, Justice for the County together with all and singular the appurtenances to the same. And the said Drank Holland Cometh that he has the right to convey the said land to the said grantee; that he said grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land, that he has done so, that he remembers the said; and that he is not subject to any further agreement of the said land as may be required.
