Randolph of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, a bachelor and head of a family, do declare and make known that I claim as husband and property, except from one, my wife, Kate B. under an old bond by the General Assembly of Virginia entered and not forsworn in which I am named as Head of a household or head of a family, that at and held a household, and personal property for the length of twenty and twenty except from one, for debt of one, dated at 20 by Mr. Justice Smith for Michael Burren and fifty and one a copy dated to be by Frederick B. in the year 1800, after which the two parties of land, the living married party was and, valued at 14 20. and the following personal property, and other, situated there, "one cow, two boys together with the inventory of all the contents of all kinds of stock, and all of my tools of every kind now in hand, one fiddle, seven fine R. hats, petticoats, household and kitchen furniture, the contents of both the trunk and Trunk Capacity, barely claimed not being too numerous to detail, but valued at 15 20. a. Myself my hand and seal this day of November 1806.

This Deed of homestead and late made this 20th day of November 1806, between J. C. White and M. C. White his wife, of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, quarters of the first part, and M. W. Whitehead of the said County and estate quarters of the second part, Witness that in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first, do agree and convey, to the said J. C. Whitehead and his heirs forever with general warranty, the following real estate lying in Southampton County, Virginia containing fifty and 50 acres, to be and more or less, being by Thomas Caldwell land on the north, by the land of Mrs. Mary A. White's former land, and on the south and east by the land of the said M. W. Whitehead's party of the second part, and commonly known as that of the Henry White tract. And the said parties of the first do hereby covenant to defend and defend forever, the premises hereby conveyed, against the claim of any and all persons whatsoever.
