

Witnessed all made by these presents, that I George H. Goodhue of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia a householder and head of a family do declare and make known that I claim as household and property except from my slaves, late 30 slaves and other present by the General Assembly of Virginia entitled an act to Assessments and what manner and in what conditions a household or head of a family shall be apportioned and held a household and personal property for the benefit of himself and family except from state for debt apportioned above 27 slaves, the following real estate to wit: And tract of Land containing 40 acres, divided to me by Justice Davis for Richard Brown and myself and one acre apportioned to be by Jacksonville Dept in the year 1870, upon which the two presents of land being marshy today are and valued at \$1000.00 and the following personal property two horses, moccasin shop, three cows, two hogs together with the number of one hundred and fifty acres of land, and set of my tools of every kind now or hereafter taken from R. Davis, potatoes, household and kitchen furniture, the selection of both the slaves and Personal Property hereby claimed as being the personal effects left unclaimed at \$500.00 Wherof my hands and seal this day of January 1876.

This Deed of Settlement made by George H. Goodhue, on this day named and acknowledged by said Goodhue to be his act and deed, and admitted to record.

The Deed of Settlement and date made this 2nd day of November 1876, between J. C. White and A. O. White the wife of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, grantor, of the first part, and D. M. Chapman of the same County and State grantee of the second part. Whereas, that in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first, doth grant and convey, to the said A. O. White and her heirs forever with general warranty, the following and estate lying in Southampton County, Virginia containing letters recd #51, east, to the sand bank, up to the bank by Florence Edwards back on the north, border back by Mrs. Mary A. White's deer park, and on old church and back by the land of the said Mr. D. M. Chapman party of the said party, as commonly known as part of the Henry White tract. And the said parties of the first, doth covenant to warrant and defend forever, the premises hereby conveyed, against the claim or claim of any and all persons whatsoever.
