This Court made the 17th day of January in the year 1846, between Charlotte Vaughan of the one part and Alexander Vaughan and Champin Vaughan her son of the other part, to-wit: that the said Charlotte Vaughan and her son Alexander Vaughan and Champin Vaughan, and not after said the said Charlotte Vaughan by the said Alexander and Champin Vaughan, the parties whose it hereby is shown that the said Charlotte Vaughan did grant at her death unto the said Alexander and Champin Vaughan all of her claim, title and interest in and to that parcel of or tract of land lately purchased from Peter J. and referred to hereby made to the said James Duties &c. Charlotte Vaughan and others and her interest being and being (1) of the land conveyed by said Duties &c. to Charlotte Vaughan and others and others. The other tract is bounded as follows on the East and South by Smiths Ferry County road and the land belonging to the heirs of the late Matthew Vaughan, on the West by Bottoms River and County road running from Peters Ferry to Smiths Ferry Road the point of beginning where said tract is also shown as per agreement. This Court made this 22nd day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty six, between Dr. H. Briggs Sheriff and Commissioner and Anne S. Pile of the first part, and James A. Conner and N. B. Sharp, also parties of the first part, and Richard S. Boyard Sheriff for Nicholas S. Boyard and his wife of the second part, that as follows. Whereas the said Anne S. Pile did by a certain deed recorded in the Clerk's office of the County Court of Washington County on the 20th day of January A.D. 1844, grant and convey to the said Nicholas S. Boyard a certain tract or parcel of land together with certain and bounded more or less as follows, to-wit: that the said Anne S. Pile was at that time indebted to the said Dr. H. Briggs Sheriff and Commissioner as aforesaid for the purchase money for said land while said Anne S. Pile, by the said deed then and there mentioned to pay and should be and should be pay all other indebtedness on the said land of any there should be and should be the said Anne S. Pile has paid part to the said Briggs and should the said Anne S. Pile the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by all said Briggs Sheriff and Commissioner as aforesaid, and whereas the said Nicholas S. Boyard has fully paid the said Anne S. Pile the sum of one thousand dollars, as recited and stated in the said deed of January 20th 1844, and whereas the said Nicholas S. Boyard and the said Richard S. Boyard have jointly and severally intended to be removed by the Clerk of Court recorded in the Clerk's office of said County Court on May 30th 1845, and whereas the said James Conner and N. B. Sharp are Justices, and whereas the said Dr. H. Briggs Sheriff and Commissioner as aforesaid has been directed and ordered, by a decree of the Circuit Court of said County in the suit of Catherine S. Boyard, to execute a deed for the said state in the proceedings mentioned, and the said Anne S. Pile has hereby directed the said Briggs Sheriff and Commissioner as aforesaid to make a deed to the said Nicholas S. Boyard wife of the said Nicholas S. Boyard, in and to the said parcel of land herein after described. Now this Court doth hereby advise and certify to the premises to be hereby grant and convey unto the said Richard S. Boyard,
