Notary Public, in the city of Southampton County, Virginia, of the best form, and before The Rev. Dr. Ridley,
of the most reverent of the other past. Disterfield, Shabot, and The M. Pentecost and Peterson, his wife,
and Consistorial of the town of the former, citizens (Deas,) several survey of the United States of America,
is good, long, still and empty, and I do make and certify that Dr. Ridley and his heirs and assigns forever,
the following real estate, to wit, a tract of ground of land, known as the Captain's Ground, and
being situated partly in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, and partly in the County of

extending eastward and fifty acres (50) more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at
the Beginning Bridge over the Neuse River, and bounded West by the County and about that
point said Bridge to Beyond Dept., on the south by a Branch (called the Bee Branch,) which constitutes
the last stream and back river side and the mouth of Henry Harwood River, at the Creek by the boundary
of the towns of Beaufort and Henryville (sic) and on the south by the Neuse River, and
is the same land which was on the 3d December 1776, by Dr. Deas Conveyed by Samuel H. Thompson
and wife to paid Dr. P. Deas and out debt Dr. Harwood, and while the said Dr. H. Thompson,
on the 2d September 1776, conveyed his interest to and said Dr. P. Deas, by Deas, which Deas
have been recorded in the Justice office in Southampton County, Virginia, and Southampton
County, 2d October, to which reference is made for further particular, together with all and
singular the appurtenances belonging to said land. So done and to hold him and his heirs and assigns forever. And the said
John Black, and the said Dr. Ridley and his heirs and assigns forever. And the said
Dr. P. Deas, for himself and his heirs and assigns, the land aforesaid and its appurtenances
as unto him and his Dr. Ridley and to his heirs and assigns, clear and will forever warrant and
defend against all persons whatever. So witness whereof the said Dr. Deas and Peterson, Dr.
