He said he desired to have the Mr. Bostwick and his heirs, executors or assigns, to defend his improvements on said land, this day sold him, & will be bound of his debts, and hereby released, if there be, last year after the date, due by Bostwick to the state and people, and year after date, being the first deferred payment on said land, and the sum of twelve hundred and forty dollars (\$124), due by Bostwick two years after the date hereof, being the second deferred payment on said land (the residue of the forehands money and land having been paid by said Bostwick, in Caples), with fees to said George Washington, as aforesaid, to suffer said Wm. D. Hougham, or his assigns to take and use the said lands to his or their own uses, etc.
