 She and David S. Cawson and Cathick S. Cawson do grant and convey unto the said Richd A. Dugayet,  
 Trustee, certain tract of land situated in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, to him  
 a part of the tract of land Richard S. Dugayet now holds in, recently purchased by David S. Cawson  
 & Cathick Cawson and bounded as follows: West by a line & Commonly at a rock in the center of  
 the old fence or road, near the water head or bank that runs from said Cawson's land toward  
 Mrs J. A. Mayes' house, thence due east about half a mile of fence, and meeting tract to  
 Cathick S. Cawson's land, thence down said Mayes' line to Richard S. Cawson's land, thence due  
 East to the boundary between Cathick S. Cawson's land and the remainder of  
 said Cawson's land to the south or road that leads from Stephen Shattocks' lot to P. G. Pease's  
 house thence due east from road nearly and south Common to the Common boundary, and end half of  
 said tract also purchased recently of the said Richard S. Dugayet. The said tract of land  
 containing two hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs forever. In trust, however, to receive  
 a bond dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of January, eighteen hundred and twenty six and due twelve months  
 after giving twenty days notice of the time and place, for all expenses necessary to remove  
 the remains of his dead brother, and eight dollars to be paid in law or money of the United States,  
 which debt is due by the said David S. Cawson and Cathick Cawson to the said Richd A. Dugayet.  
 It is stipulated and agreed upon by the parties to this deed that if the said David S. Cawson  
 and Cathick Cawson shall fail to pay the above named sum and interest by the 28<sup>th</sup> day  
 of January, eighteen hundred and twenty six, then shall the said Richd A. Dugayet set his legal  
 processes upon them at their several abodes, he said trustee to sell the said tract of land for  
 cash after giving twenty days notice of the time and place, for all expenses necessary to remove  
 the remains of his dead brother, the said trustee first just and convenient, giving all that may  
 be due at the said bond principal and interest to the said Richd A. Dugayet at his legal  
 processes, and the balance of any sum to the said David S. Cawson and the said Cathick S.  
 Cawson's executors generally, the property remaining.
