

First George C. Collier was as Commissioner ordered to record certain grants in his hands giving full the sale of the lands in the preceding mentioned, and whereas right and title to the lot of Collier alias being of opinion that the interests of the parties would be fully taken care of by the hundred of one hundred and eighty seven acres instead of two hundred and eight acres as by such third orders; and although the said Collier alias has actually purchased and had the land set for and for and 177 acres as also agreed to be paid for the said 215 acres in such above described; And therefore this said witness shall that the said John G. Miller for his services and in consideration of the sum of ten hundred and twenty five dollars and 25 cents paid to him by the said Collier Commissioners, the which above is hereby acknowledged by the said John G. Miller party of the first part, that by their present friends and enemies with greatest sincerity and the said Margaret A. Clark, and her infant children parties of the second and third before named, shall certain tract or parcels of land situate in the County of Rockingham State of Virginia containing one hundred and eighty seven acres more or less as appears by the plat signed George D. Spring, and filed herewith being part of the tract purchased by the 1<sup>st</sup> M<sup>th</sup> of Maryland O. Chambers near Blackwell in said County and County 60<sup>th</sup> M<sup>th</sup> by deed dated 11<sup>th</sup> July 1775 and duly recorded, wherein it is clearly made at part of this tract. And it is hereby generally understood, and stipulated that the land hereby is to be held by the said Henry and children as a hereditary manor and by virtue of the laws of this State in like manner as that the estate which was sold by order of the Circuit Court of the County of James City in the Chancery proceeding styled Margaret A. Clark and children ex parte now holding in said lands which Chancery proceeding is hereby referred to as part of this deed, for just and particular information as to the purchase and the rights of the parties.
