 I recd the sum I barged, 1 Cart and 3 pair Catt whels, 1 George Shipp, Smithfield and
 of the same the following furniture of every description, a late bed and warming implements of
 bed, bedding and all house. We trust to leave the payment of a bond for the payment of all
 taxes and dues of this date with this debt due by said Caleb Cottrell to G. H. Cottrell, And it
 is specially agreed by the parties to this debt, that no sale shall take place
 before 1777 by either party, for the payment of said sum from this date, provided the
 same, as per
 said Caleb Cottrell shall pay promptly at the expiration of each year from
 this date the interest on the said bond above described. And it is further agreed
 R. D. Cottrell and wife shall pay any sum arising out of the payment of each year from
 this date the interest on the said bond above described. And it is further agreed
