This Deed made this 29<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy five between Richard H. Doyner and Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton parties of the first part and William B. Miller of the County of Brunswick 2<sup>d</sup> party of the second part, Witness: that in consideration of the sum of one thousand and thirty five dollars Richard H. Doyner and Elizabeth his wife do grant unto the said William B. Miller with general warranty a certain piece or parcel of land, situate lying and being in Southampton County 2<sup>d</sup> and containing twelve acres or less, bounded as follows: to the North by the land of Richard H. Doyner South by the State line adjoining North Carolina on the East by the Crow first Creek West by the land of Daniel A. Jones. The said Richard H. Doyner covenants that he has the right to convey the said land, & the grante; that he has done so and to encumber the said land, that the grante shall have good possession of the said land free from all encumbrances; and that parties hereunto joined shall execute such further and other things as may be requisite.
