to South Ferry; bounded south by the land of James Codd and east by the land of J. D.  
Briddle, that said J. D. Briddle and Mary J. D. Briddle concur in that they have the  
right to convey the said land to the grantees, that there have done no acts to encumber  
the said lands, that the grantees shall have quiet possession of the said land, free from  
all encumbrances, and J. D. Briddle and Mary J. D. Briddle his wife, granted of the  
said part, will execute such further affirmances of the said land as may be required.
