This Deed made this 26<sup>th</sup> day of February one thousand eight hundred and seventy six between Thomas J. Bellows of the one part and Henry M. Williams of the other part, Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of two thousand five hundred and twenty five dollars, (2525<sup>00</sup>), the said Thomas Bellows hath sold and did grant unto the said Henry M. Williams his heir and assigns forever, three hundred and seventy two and a half acres of land, (by a creek running of S. & W. 222<sup>00</sup> feet at its mouth and not by the acre, lying on the west side of the road from the residence of said Bellows, beginning at a mark buried in the center of the road a road line running N. 55<sup>00</sup> W. 1/2 a pole on a bearing towards a corner to P. S. Dwyer in George Dwyer's line, thence along Dwyer's to William Calk's line then along Calk's line to a pine mill race except two, thence easterly by a road line to a red oak, thence to a red oak corner to P. S. Dwyer and William Calk's line along said Williams' line to a red oak on the intersection and branch of the road, thence southerly along the center of said road to the beginning, being bounded on the north by the lands of P. S. Dwyer and William Calk, and on the south by P. S. Dwyer and that by Wm. Dwyer and the Calk's land. The said Williams is to have the privilege of giving said stream his life, at the old site on the West side of the Road.
