1st January 1777 when where affidavit made in the payment of the said sum the
said trustee shall upon request made by David O'Connor after ten days after the
said sum paid for Coal and after discharging the acts of field work by the
lamb and the felance of any way over to the said John S. Bishop. And the

a horse by the said John O'Connor giving a warrant of attorney for the purpose
