Not Dated made this 1st day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and ten between John Biddle & his wife, Esther Coll and themselves his wife and Rev. W. Codd and Sarah C. his wife of the County of Greenbaptist and State of Virginia of the first part, and Joseph Gregory, Anthony Parker, Franklin Daughton, Robert Biddle, Charles Holland, A. Donell and Williamson Liles of said County and State their trustees for the purpose hereinafter mentioned of the second part, Wimbley Park for and in consideration of the sum of five dollars to them of hand paid. The receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. And by the said parties of the first part, trustees and by their agent Wm. Biddle with the said parties of the second part, trustees and to their successors in office. The following pieces or parcels of land lying in the County of Greenbaptist and immediately North of the village of Franklin and bounded as follows beginning at a large Cypress standing immediately on the edge of the Creek running into Black Water river, and about eighty feet above the Creek flowing on such river, thence a rock notch of well about 15 feet to a White Oak just buried at the back side of the rock bordering from Franklin, known as the main or River rock between Biddle and 103 feet and to another notch along said rock to a White Oak post buried on the east side of the river. Thence eastwardly a straight line 150 feet to a red or Water oak standing on the same bank. Thence further eastwardly a continuation of said straight line about 55 feet to a White oak post buried on the waters edge of the river aforesaid white Post standing along the river and Creek about 100 feet back to the large Cypress. The line of beginning the same on which the house of assembly abutting belongs to the African Methodist Church now standing the 1st west lot given by Robert B. Davis next to said Church and occupied by Mr. Harry P. Davis at his back to Hoppy Hill & River containing a total bounded and described a tract of three 1/2 acres of land as have also to be held by the said parties of the second part, trustees and their successors in office. In trust to each for the use of the members and congregation of the African Methodist Church at Franklin Virginie, to erect a parsonage in addition to the house of worship as it now stands or other of their choice the following signatures and date the day and year above written.
