present and admitted to record.

Date, McDonald, C.R.

This Deed made the 1st day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ten, Year of the
Legal and Natural Period of Life after Death, etc. of Washington County, Virginia,
Witnesseth, that the said William H. Peartree, grant unto the said James R. Taylor with general
power, the following property to-wit, his House, Cabin, Shop and their increases, Contingent
Family, implements, half of all his Pets & Livestock in the Woods, half of all the Sheep and
other live stock in the Woods and Pasturage, also his Crop of all kinds, such as Corn, Peas, Beans, etc.
etc. to be sold to George Peartree in the sum of One Hundred Dollars¹⁰⁰ for delivery due
by bond, dated the 17th day of April, 1870, with legal interest. I also claim the benefits of the
Reunited Confederacy as to this said Estate.

This Deed of Sale from William H. Peartree to James R. Taylor, Deuter, for the benefit of
Daniel R. Peartree, was this day received and acknowledged by said Peartree to his act and date, and
admitted to record.

Date, McDonald, C.R.

This Deed made this 17th day of April 1870, between Richard Barrett and Lydia C.
Deale, his wife, who was formerly Lydia C. Lovell, formerly Deale, heirs of the first
and 2^d Estates of the second part, Hertford. That Richard Barrett, died by his
last will and testament, which was duly recorded in the Clerk's office of Washington at
the Spring Term 1865, did direct his tract of land to his brother H. C. Deale, after it should
be appraised by three or more Competent Judges of the worth of land, and directed that
his said brother H. C. Deale should pay to his two sisters, Lydia C. Deale & Lydia C. Peartree,
two third each of the valuation of the said land, as apportioned by the said Judges, and
that said Judge selected for the appraisal did for the valuation of the said land at \$1000.
and divided the said two Deale Girls, in proportion of the provision of the will of the
said Mr. Deale, did pay to Lydia C. Deale the sum of \$500. being the one third
of the said valuation of the said land, to which she was entitled, and divided the said \$500.
Deale did also pay to Lydia C. Deale the sum of \$500. being the one third of the said
valuation of the said land, to which she was entitled, and took receipte from the said
Deale & Peartree, dated yesterday 16th day of February 1870, and witness since the said
receipts were received. Lydia C. Deale had intermarried with one Richard Barrett, and
the said Lydia C. Deale, with one C. C. Barrett, who has deceased this day, and Richard
the said heir of the first part are agreed to more fully secure the said H. C. Deale in
concerning a portion of the land, desired to him by the will of the said Deale
H. C. Deale, her husband the said Hertford. That is consideration of the before mentioned
sums, the said Richard Barrett, and Dorothy C. Deale, and Lydia C. Deale,
part of the first part as aforesaid, as grant and convey with generally warranty to
the said H. C. Deale to have his heirs forever, all right title or interest of any kind
whatsoever, to which they might be entitled in law or equity, in the land desired by
the said H. C. Deale as aforesaid. Witness the following signatures next.
