Whereas by a decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, entered
at October term 1851, it is judge Chancery suit of Bennett vs. Edwards
and others, H. C. Hafford was appointed a Commissioner to sell the tract of land
belonging to the late John Doe, containing 1000 acres thereof, and
in addition to the discretion of said Commissioner to sell the tract of land to the highest bidder, and the sum of

Henry C. Hafford, containing One Hundred acres, and bounded by the land of
L. P. Edwards, Sally May Parker, and the said H. C. Hafford Commissioner and
covenants with him to set bound of land as is settled in bond by said deacons.
