

Mental by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 35 of the Code of Virginia, 1852, named H. Corlett, Surveyor of Staunton County, did, on the 15th day of December, 1852, being Court-day, sell at the Courthouse of said County, for sum of money, fragment of land bounded, a tract of land, according to the following description, viz:

The name of the person charged with taxes was David Austin, Esq.
The quantity of land charged was 99 acres.

The legal description of the land was as follows: One Statute Acre.

The amount of taxes due and \$ 82.

And whereas the date of said sale has already passed and no one interest has acquired the said land according to the 1st and 2d sections of the aforesaid Chapter, and whereas the purchaser of the aforesaid land, had an acquaintance with the 3^d section of the aforesaid Chapter, had a signed warrant by the Sheriff of the aforesaid County to the County Court, specifying the name and lands of said land, & the name of the amount of adjoining tract and giving such particular description as will more fully identify the same; reference is made to said warrant, now filed among the County Court of Staunton County, at the County Court-house, and will be returned to the same as soon as done. And whereas the said J. L. Barhand who became the purchaser of the aforesaid tract of land, has applied to me, Gideon P. Edwards, Clerk of the County Court of Staunton County, for a deed for the ownership of land, now known as Gideon P. Edwards, Clerk of the County Court of Staunton, by virtue of the foregoing and the authority given me by Section 35, Chapter 35, Code of Virginia, 1852, to hereby grant and convey, with special warranty, to the said J. L. Barhand the tract of land bought by him of James H. Corlett, Surveyor as aforesaid, on the day and year aforesaid, bounded as follows, to-wit:

Lot No. 5, in the Street called Containing 99 acres, beginning at a pine on the edge of the hill corner for lot No. 1, S 18 E 10 6 rods to a large pine in the end of a bounded corner for lot No. 4, thence up the said branch it runs to a dead pine near the edge of a ravine, thence S 18 E 10 6 rods to a large pine, thence S 18 E 10 6 rods to a white oak, thence S 18 E 10 6 rods to a dead oak near two small pines and a good corner for lot No. 5. thence N 74 1/2 E 20 6 rods to a small black pine on the edge of the last ground, whence the same extends to a pine above down hill across to first station.
