This Deed of Homestead made by David Edwards, real estate owner, and acknowledged by said Edwards to be his act and deed, and executed to word:

This Deed made the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May and thousand eight hundred and twenty six (1876) by Benjamin D. Dwyer a householder and head of a family of the County of Southwold, State of Virginia, Testifying that the said Harrison D. Dwyer, late holder, does her intention to leave out his land called a Homestead, by virtue of an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, passed April 27<sup>th</sup> A.D. 1850, in trust to the following property, and under payment, to take for the benefit of himself his wife Rosalie, David Dwyer, and his children, minor, Adah, Elizabeth, Luther, Dennis, Charles Edwards, Harry, Virginia and Anna, and such other children as may be hereafter born, and to leave to them. Dwyer right to a certain tract of land which is in said County, & being the same on which the said Harrison D. Dwyer resides, sufficient to contain one hundred and twenty five acres, more or less bounded by described lines, & in Harrison's lands, Lucy Johnson and others, which said property is in said farm value of \$1000.00

All of his interest from the sale of a piece of land sold to Cornelius Dwyer which belonged to the estate of Harrison Dwyer deceased, and now is in the hands of T. J. Flagg, Sheriff and Clerk of Harrison's Estate

All of said property is claimed as a Homestead, consisting to the except few long, zigzag, cross-timbering or like, according to right title of Harrison.

This Deed of Homestead made by Harrison D. Dwyer, real estate owner, and acknowledged by said Dwyer to be his act and deed, and executed to word

Seth Edwards, C. L.

This instrument entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 1876 between David J. Painter of the first part and David J. Conley of the other part, testifying as follows, that  
whereas the said David J. Conley is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is  
desirous to have supplied during the year 1876 from the said David J. Painter for the  
amount of forty dollars, supplies which amount the said Conley must not go and the  
said Conley having agreed on his part to furnish and supply the said Conley and his family  
and his flock, and in consideration of the above provision the hereby grant a  
line to the said Conley on one side of Cotton to eight feet broad and fifty  
feet in width, of the first picking out, to be determined by each Conley and Painter  
Deed out of the crop of 1876 made on the lands when the said Conley may first  
have the above amount of demand, which has been or will be intended to have been  
supplied. This line is granted under an act of the General Assembly of Virginia
