

(Under legs, to calculate cost of cotton, corn and fodder worth during the year 1870. On trust
to receive the payment of a load of iron date each the first day of the month of October, 1870, also
for the sum of One hundred dollars bearing interest from the first day of October 1870, also J. C. Bailey
will not sue his said J. C. Bailey for the sum of Twenty two Thousand dollars, dated Dec. 1st,
with such interest from date, also a load due the said C. S. Davis for forty two thousand
dollars and demands, with due notice from date and dated Dec. 1st, 1870. It is agreed by
the parties to this deed that the first two mentioned loads of one hundred and forty two
thousand dollars due the said J. C. Bailey shall be paid back out of the proceeds of the above
named property. If a sum is further agreed by the parties to this deed, should a sale take place
under this deed, it shall be often ten or fifteen days notice of time and place, and upon
such terms as the parties of the said first may suggest - and not earlier nor later. The
Debt shall be entitled to a commissary of first for cost or graft, cost of sales.

This First month of May 1870 between H. G. Dunning of Petersburg 2nd of
the first class and P. G. Williams of the second class, whereas the said H. G. Dunning has been
unsuccessful in his pecuniary circumstances and is anxious to secure all his individual creditors
paid, for rate, and without priority or preference an equal proportion of his undrawn
and property and effects, and whereas by this dated 1st day of May 1870, which has
been or will be duly recorded in the County Court Clerk's office of Sevier County, Tenn.
he did as a husbandman and head of a family claim the benefit of a homestead as
provided by law and as such homestead did stand the tract or parcels of land hereinbefore
described between P. G. Williams; and whereas on 31st day of September 1870, he brought
of justice action for the sum of \$1600. from A. E. Leonard John Brown and Charles L.
Stringfellow Commissioners for the Chamberlain Bank standing in the Village of the
City of Petersburg styled John Brown Coal & Co. Petersburg, alias as the house
