The Agreement between David J. Dardens and Benjamin J. Colcord, made this day record and
with its certificate thereto annexed, admitted to record.

The said David J. Dardens made this 1st day of May 1876 before me, James H. Colcord, of the first
part, and David Ransom, Deuter of the second part, witness, that he and David H. C.
Colcord, his great uncle, the said David Ransom, Deuter with general warranty, the following
having to write all of said Colcord's debts of Court, fees, expenses and otherwise
that he makes in this place to me last near Roanokeville T. in the year 1876, he took to
serve a bond for Dardens and Company, twenty five dollars dated the 1st day of May
1876 without interest until 1st July 1877, and it is hereby agreed by and between the parties
above named and Colcord, that none of the said debts are now to be paid off or settled, or sold;
but without the consent of the said Dardens and Company, the said Colcord shall have the
right to sue to the Deuter of Roanoke, Decher, as and at present outstanding, to shall all and
pay the debt, and if any left pay over to Colcord, if not enough the Deuter shall
be enough of the other debts to pay such debt, and Colcord Company each pay over
balance, if any to said Colcord. Witness the following seals and signatures this day

the above advances, does hereby grant and give to the said
plaintiff, or all the Corp which may be made during the
present year (1876), upon the land now being cultivated by him
the said Baker Brothers, for the amount of the above advances, which
land has, or will soon be separated, this sum is granted under
an act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April the
1st 1873, intituled, the Act of Advance Advances for payment
