

Notar by a deed of the Genl Court, of Southampton, entered at the City Court 1791, in
 the County, and before the Justice of the Peace, and appointed a special Court to sell the
 said estate whereon Geo. D. Jones died seized, and advised the purchase of said estate, the
 said Court did sell the said land by public auction Oct. 16, 1791, and at the said sale,
 the said J. D. Harrison bought the purchase, by bidding thereof the sum of \$1250, and advised
 thereof entered in and put at City Court 1791, the advised Court, and ordered to settle the
 said land, and whereas of the said estate the said J. D. Harrison became the purchaser by bidding
 the sum of \$1250, and whereas the estate of the original purchaser being his
 said J. D. Harrison, and whereas the said J. D. Harrison, by his certificate under his hand and
 seal dated May 5th 1796, and filed in the papers of the aforesaid sale, did declare the
 same paid all that was due, and whereas the same has been by the said Harrison,
 the said J. D. Harrison did make this 15th day of June 1796, between J. D. Jones, special Court
 as aforesaid of said Court, and Geo. D. Harrison of the City Court, special Court
 as aforesaid of the aforesaid, and the sum of \$1250, the said J. D. Jones, Court as
 aforesaid did grant, and convey with special warranty, to the said Geo. D. Harrison the
 following tract of land, to wit: a certain parcel of land situated in Southampton
 County containing 213 acres, to the same more or less bounded by the lands of J. H. S.
 Rogers estate, of J. D. Jones and others, land being the land whereof Geo. D. Jones

 said Court and Geo. D. Jones, Justice of the Peace, witness: that in consideration of
 five dollars, the said party of first part did grant and convey with special warranty
 to the said J. D. Harrison, the following real estate, to wit: a certain tract of land in
 Southampton County, containing 213 acres, to the same more or less bounded by the lands
 of J. H. S. Rogers estate, Geo. D. Jones and others, land being the land formerly belonging
 to Geo. D. Jones, and conveyed by J. D. Jones, Court to Geo. D. Harrison of the City Court

June 1796, and recorded in Clerk's office of Southampton, and trust to receive
 a debt due by said Geo. D. Harrison to J. D. Jones, the said J. D. Jones, Court for above
 hundred and fifty dollars, due by land dated June 22nd 1796. And it is agreed by
 the parties thereto that for the sum of a tale by virtue of that debt, the parties thereto
 be entitled to find five each commissions on gross sales, and the sale shall be upon
 such terms as the Commissioners may devise. Witness the following signatures and seals.
