hundred and twenty six, between John A. Bennett of the first part and George
A. Daugherty, Justice of the second part, both of the County of Southampton State
of Virginia heretofore. That the said George A. Daugherty hereby grants and conveys unto
the said John A. Bennett the following tract of land to wit. All that tract or parcel
of land lying in said County, commonly called the "Pembroke tract subject to
certain four hundred acres more or less bounded by the lands of the said Wagoner,
R. Wright & wife, Littleton S. Penner and others. In tract to name the prop-
erty of a tract for the sum of Eight hundred dollars (800.00) due to
George A. Daugherty (less George A. Penner and Daniel E. Penner) merchant and
previous trading under the style of George A. Daugherty which said lands is of real
estate and freehold, but is due and payable January 1st A.D. 1877.

Mr. C. Bruffee Chevalier the following real property to wit. the said
Daugherty's undivided half interest in certain lots or parcels of land lying in the
