

Know all men by these presents, that I, Oliver Gray of the County of Southampton
 Virginia, and subscriber of the sum of Fifty dollars and $\frac{1}{2}$ cents, acknowledged me by Dr. C. A.
 Nichols, of Suffolk, Merchant, as is shown by due bills and accounts for the same, do
 sell and convey unto him, the following property, to wit: One hundred and Seven bushels and
 his entire crop of Corn and fodder, Peanuts, peas and Cotton seeds during the year 1876,
 Dr. Rose and Nichols to him, the greater and the less. And against payment thereof, do warrant and
 justify for all encumbrance, and fully defend the right. It is agreed, however, that if
 the greater, or my representative, pay unto Dr. C. A. Nichols in his representation, the
 sum above named, in or before the 1st day of December 1876, in satisfaction for this property,
 and until such payment shall not write, destroy, injure, sell or remove the same, and in
 case of injury or death from any cause, of any cattle, horses or hogs, that convey, held myself,
 and others responsible for the full value thereof, causing all damages sustained, by loss
 of horses and wagons, horses, Cattle, shall bear and be paid, otherwise remain in
 my sole effect. As default in the foregoing condition, the greater or his representative, may
 sell the above property at auction, at any time, after ten days notice to the greater. Meaning
 the sum of money secured above, and all cost and charges of the sale, including the surplus, if
 any, to the greater or his representative. It is agreed, also, that with default of these conditions
 the greater may retain possession of the property; and that the greater or his representative,
 may purchase at any sale made of aforesaid.

This Deed of Sale made this 17th day of January 1876, between Joseph Turner the
 greater of the first party, and J. William Roddy the smaller of the second party, Pittsylvania
 County, for and in consideration of five dollars and seven pence for the party of the first part
 the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the party of the first part, to pay
 and convey unto the said J. William Roddy the smaller, the following property to wit:
 all the crops of every description growing and to be planted and grown by the said
 Joseph Turner upon the farm for which he has rights now by Dr. C. A. Nichols
 Roddy during the year 1876, the out parts of land and entire stocks of hogs and
 cattle. So that he has to secure J. W. Roddy for a sum of one hundred dollars \$100
 January 1876. It is further agreed that the said Joseph Turner shall on or before
 the 1st day of January 1877, pay to J. W. Roddy and debt and interest. That the smaller
 shall have the privilege after ten days notice of three months, shall in said County
 sell all the property herein conveyed for cash and out of the proceeds pay said
 debt, interest and costs and balance of such proceeds of any money due to the said
 Joseph Turner or his assigns. Circuit court may and shall set aside this day of May 1876
