

A Contract and Agreement made and entered into this first day of May in the year 1876, by and between F. J. Ridley and P. J. Kelly - wherein the said F. J. Ridley is engaged in the cultivation of the soil in the County of Loudoun, and he said P. J. Kelly is willing to make certain advances and payment in money to enable the said Ridley to carry on his farming operations for and during the year 1876, to an amount not exceeding four hundred dollars. See this Contract witness that for each and every payment of such advances to be made by the said P. J. Kelly to the said F. J. Ridley at such times as he may be required to do so, to an amount in the aggregate not exceeding the sum of four hundred dollars, the said F. J. Ridley carrying to the said Kelly all the costs of every kind, made up to make an acre land cultivated by him, the said Ridley, in said County, in the said year 1876, upon which said Corp. the said Kelly is to have an account for all advances made by him as herein before stated until the same shall be fully paid; and shall sell and dispose of the same for such purpose.

Phillips of the County of Staunton, State of Virginia of the first part and Henry Hinckley trustee for William H. Davis of said County, and State of the second part, witness as follows: That the said George H. Phillips party of the first part, did heretofore hold and by these presents did convey out the said Henry Hinckley trustee to the said Davis party of the second part, his interest in all the Corps which he may have on the farm of the said William H. Davis consisting of one hundred acres called pasture to the west branch to record a debt due said William H. Davis by him for three hundred dollars of corn etc with this deed. One of the said George H. Phillips heirs pay or cause to be paid unto the said W. H. Davis or his legal representative the sum of three hundred dollars together with all interest which may accrue on both from the obligation to be paid or due to remain in full force and interest.
