

Noticed made by C. G. Parkman and wife Alice G. Parkman to A. R. Cleveland,  
 P. Shambaugh and A. L. Umstead being known as Commissioners Marksmen for the City of  
 New York under the first name and style of Amherst etc., leatherback that said C. G.  
 Parkman wrote for and in consideration of ten dollars to have no back paid. The receipt  
 which is highly acknowledged, bears longhand and dated, and is by these presents of money  
 to the said Amherst etc. one tract of land lying in County State of Virginia known  
 as the French Forkland tract of land bounded on the North by the lands of Alexander  
 Davis and on the East by the lands of the heirs of Dr. Davis, and to the South by the lands of  
 J. C. Davis and on the West by the lands of Joseph Davis and Samuel Davis containing  
 one hundred and forty acres. Said tract back to the said Amherst etc.  
 and other heirs. And for the consideration aforesaid. The said C. G. Parkman doth  
 acknowledge and declare the following personal property, two black mule, two brown horses and  
 one brown mare, 1 top buggy, 1 open buggy, 1 saddle and a few robes on the traps  
 etc. etc. and Parkman may have during the present year 1876. The condition of the above  
 said land and back to such black leatherback said Amherst and C. have agreed to advance to  
 said C. G. Parkman during the present year money to enable him the said Parkman's  
 estimate has found in this State to the extent of one hundred and twenty five dollars  
 and 50 cents. The balance of said Parkman shall on or before January 1, 1877, pay off such  
 amount and all debts including the usual Commissioners' charges by Commissioners aforesaid for  
 making advance, that this debt and back and to ride and eat, but of default  
 to ride in such traps and al least during 1877, that it shall be lawful for the  
 said Amherst etc. or heirs aforesaid to seize said traps and personal property etc.  
 etc. and also ride and back on the premises after giving twenty days notice of  
 the same and apply the proceeds of such sale to the payment of such advance and  
 the balance if any to be paid to the executors of said Parkman.  
 Now witness where say C. G. Parkman and wife Alice G. Parkman have  
 at our hand and sealed this 11<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1876.
