This Indenture made the 17th day of January in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and seventy six, between George S. Ball of the
 one part, and Henry Ball of the other part, Witnesseth: That the said
 George S. Ball in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars, lawful
 money of Virginia, to him in hand paid, by the said Henry Ball, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, has lawfully and sold, and by these presents
 has given and sold unto the said Henry Ball, his heirs and assigns forever, a
 certain tract of land lying in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia,
 and attached to the land formerly known as the Crab Branch, and bounded
 as follows: Beginning at a pine corner in Brantley's line, being to a pine
 c. in Brantley's land thence line thence to a Red Oak in Brantley's line
 thence to the old pond Branch, and thence along the run of the said Branch
 to the Crab Branch, thence along the Crab Branch down to the first stone
 and containing twenty four acres more or less, together with all ways, water
 water courses, timber, and whatsoever else might thereunto, and for the
 said Henry Ball of the County of Southampton State of Virginia to have
 and to hold to himself and his heirs forever, free from the claim of George
 S. Ball of the above mentioned County (State) and his heirs and all and every
 other person or persons whatsoever, shall with and do personal and depose
 sworn by these presents. And witness whereof the said George S. Ball, has
 hereunto set his hand and seal the day and year above written.
