 and save harmless the said J. R. P. Wilson from any loss he may sustain
 by reason of becoming security for said J. R. P. Wilson to the forthcoming
 bonds and payable to J. R. P. Wilson and also to J. R. P. Wilson, and of J. R. P. Wilson
 means the payment of a bond due by said J. R. P. Wilson to J. R. P. Wilson
