

The Oath made this 16<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty (1821) William Powell, Sheriff of the County of Southampton Virginia of the one part, and George H. Kerwin, Justice of the Peace of the other part, Witnesseth that whereas the said Wm. Powell of the one part justly indebted to Amanda South in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars due by law bearing true date with these presents and bearing date from date and whereas the said Wm. Powell desired to secure the payment of the aforesaid bond of two hundred and fifty dollars in the payment of said debt in consideration thereof, and in consideration of the sum of one dollar in hand paid by the said George H. Kerwin Justice of the Peace with the said George H. Kerwin Justice at his right, with and subject in a certain tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Southampton Virginia containing one hundred acres more or less beginning the lands of J. M. Stephens, J. C. Stephens, J. W. Keaton, Wm. J. South and others together with all the appurtenances belonging thereto, in trust to secure the payment of the aforesaid bond of two hundred and fifty dollars, and it is covenanted between the parties aforesaid, should a sale be necessary under this deed, that it shall take place at the Court House of said County after the same has been publicly advertised for the space of ten days, and out of the proceeds of such sale the said George H. Kerwin shall first pay the Cost of Sale and the trust and a Commission to himself of five per centum on the amount of sale. Now pay of the aforesaid bond of two hundred and fifty dollars with all accounts interest thereon, and the remainder if any, he shall pay over to the said Wm. Powell or his personal Representative.
