Notices of Trust made this the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1876 between Wm. H. Edwards Clerk of the first party, L. D. Morris Doctor of the second party and C. A. Parvin of the third party, Southampton, Ohio in consideration of the sum of five dollars to him just named and the sum of five dollars hereinafter mentioned. The said party of the first part does grant and convey with general warranty to the said L. D. Morris Doctor to him and his heirs forever, the following personal property in Southampton County Virginia, his entire stock of cattle, household furniture which he may make during this year 1876 upon the lands he has in cultivation and his herds in trust however to receive the payment of a tenth of ten dollars each this due for four hundred and fifty dollars on demands and due the said C. A. Parvin by the tenth of the first year. And it is agreed by the parties to this deed that a sale shall be made under this deed, it shall be after twenty days notice of the time and place and upon such terms as the said C. A. Parvin may designate and in such case event the trustee shall be entitled to a commission of five per cent.
