This Agreement entered into this the 3rd day of October 1876, between Willard E.
Harris of the one part, and L. Heathcock of the other part, testifying: Whereas the said
John L. Heathcock is engaged in cultivating the soil and is desirous to obtain during the
remainder of the year advances in money or supplies from the said Willard E.
Harris to the amount of five hundred dollars, beyond which limit the said John L.
Heathcock shall not go and the said Willard E. Harris have agreed as follows
to furnish the said advances, now the said John L. Heathcock on his part in consideration
of the above sum to be truly granted him a bill to the said Willard E. Harris on the
books which may be made during the year 1876, before the time in this cultivation
of which the above amount of advanced has been or will intended to have been
expended. This bill is granted with an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia
A.D. 1876 April 3^d last entitled An Act to Secure Advances for Agricultural
