This Agreement entered into this 26th day of May 1876 between Concord and Keyrick of the first part, and Samuel W. Carshaw of the other part, Witness that whereas the said Samuel W. Carshaw is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1876, from the said Concord and Keyrick, for the amount of One thousand and seventy five Dollars, beyond which amount the said Carshaw shall not go, and the said Concord and Keyrick having agreed to furnish said supplies. Now the said Samuel W. Carshaw of his part and in consideration of the above promised, has hereby given a bond to the said Concord and Keyrick on all the crops, which may be made during the year 1876 upon the above and of which the said Carshaw certifies; also one day hence for the above amount of advances, which has been or is intended to have been expended. Now it is furthermore agreed by the parties to this agreement that the said Concord and Keyrick shall be first paid and satisfied, after which the balance, if any, shall be paid over to the said Carshaw. Now this is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 3rd 1875, entitled an Act to secure the advances for agricultural purposes.
